OPPORTUNITY BUILDERS, INC.

A non-profit organization devoted to giving adults with developmental disabilities, living in Anne Arundel County and adjacent communities, the training and services needed to help them function and pay their way in the community. OBI provides vocational training & employment services to individuals with developmental disabilities in an atmosphere that promotes feelings of independence and selfworth. About one-fourth of OBI workers, who range from 18 to 60 years of age, receive no taxpayer support at all.

- Adult Development Center. . .for people who require an intense level of training and assistance.
- Vocational Training. . .OBI contracts with local businesses for work which allows workers to earn a daily wage.
- Supported Employment. . .many of OBI's workers can and are earning a paycheck through positions in local businesses.

BELLO MACHRE, INC.

A non-profit organization which provides loving care and creates opportunities for children and adults with developmental disabilities to live and work as independently as possible. This loving care is provided in a number of settings:

- The Campus Program is a setting of five group homes, each staffed by a trained Residence Manager and several support staff. Six individuals live in each home.
- Community Living provides exceptional care in community-based group homes, with no more than three individuals living in each home.
- Adult Living provides a living alternative for those who no longer need intensive supervision and training. Each person lives with a carefully selected individual or family and truly becomes a part of that family.

The Arc of the Central Chesapeake Region

The Arc of the Central Chesapeake Region's mission is to promote respect, create opportunities and advocate for equal rights for all people with intellectual and developmental disabilities.
